



## Health and Safety Policy Education Programs

An inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists in any public place where people are present. COVID-19 is an extremely contagious disease that can lead to severe illness and death. By enrolling and participating in Olympia Family Theater's education program, you voluntarily assume all risks related to exposure to COVID-19.

### Health Policy

To ensure the safety of our campers and staff, **OFT requires that anyone entering the facility be free of symptoms** related to the COVID-19 virus, such as: fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath, fatigue, muscle/body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, or any cold or flu like symptoms.

By registering for camps, you confirm that all members of your group are not currently experiencing these symptoms.

### Drop-Off and Pick-Up

An OFT Staff Member will be at the main doors to check students in and conduct a temperature check. Please have masks on prior to arrival. Parents should stay with their student outside until the student has been cleared to enter the building. To limit exposure, the building is closed to all other visitors, including parents.

### Healthy Camper Code of Conduct

We are committed to providing a healthy and safe environment at Olympia Family Theater. By enrolling in our education programs, the camper is agreeing to:

- Wear a face covering that covers your nose and mouth. **Masks are required both inside and outside**
- No bandanas or gaiter-style masks please. They should be well fitting and multi-layer.
- Maintaining proper social distancing (6-feet) from others
- Following directional signage and teacher instructions
- Wash and/or sanitize hands periodically or at the request of a staff member

### Additional Measures

OFT has an improved air handler with high filtration levels and UV light disinfectant to help stop the spread indoors. High contact areas will be sanitized between classes and at the end of the day. Only staff and students are allowed in the building at this time. We are closed to the general public.

If someone develops symptoms of COVID-19 while at OFT, the person will be separated from the group (with supervision from an OFT office manager) until they are able to leave the facility.

If a student or staff member tests positive for COVID-19, all group members that came into contact with that person will be notified and should self-quarantine for 14 days. Additional resources will be shared at that time.
