



Health and Safety Policy Education Programs

An inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists in any public place where people are present. COVID-19 is an extremely contagious disease that can lead to severe illness and death. By enrolling and participating in Olympia Family Theater's education program, you voluntarily assume all risks related to exposure to COVID-19.

Health Policy

To ensure the safety of our campers and staff, **OFT requires that anyone entering the facility be free of symptoms** related to the COVID-19 virus, such as: fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath, fatigue, muscle/body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, or any cold or flu like symptoms.

By registering for camps, you confirm that all members of your group are not currently experiencing these symptoms.

We STRONGLY ENCOURAGE all campers to wear face masks.

Additional Measures

OFT has an improved air handler with high filtration levels and UV light disinfectant to help stop the spread indoors. High contact areas will be sanitized between classes and at the end of the day.

If someone develops symptoms of COVID-19 while at OFT, the person will be separated from the group (with supervision from an OFT office manager) until they are able to leave the facility.

If a student or staff member tests positive for COVID-19, all group members that came into contact with that person will be notified and should self-quarantine at home for 5 days but may return after 5 days as long as they wear a mask. Additional resources will be shared at that time.
